FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Friends in Christ, Lutherans tend to place a great deal of weight on the sermon; I know because I was one of those Lutherans! Before seminary, whenever I attended worship, I always saw

the sermon as being the most important thing in the service. Now, however, while I always want a sermon that makes me think (and one that convicts me of my own sin so that I realize once again just how much I need Jesus), I also recognize that the sermon isn't the only place to hear the Word of God preached on a Sunday morning. My seminary training, along with my time in ministry and the wisdom and encouragement of my colleagues have helped me understand that preaching isn't found ONLY in the words of a formal sermon on Sunday mornings.

As Lutherans, we enjoy a beautiful and storied liturgical tradition and pattern of worship. The structure of our service has been used for hundreds and hundreds of years—all of it meant to preach to us, all of it for the Holy Spirit to use within us.

Preaching comes in the sermon, yes, but it also happens in the liturgy, the scripture readings, and most especially (perhaps even most meaningful because it is tangible and it is FOR US) in the sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism. When the Holy Spirit called me to Bone Lake Lutheran, a Letter of Call was generated. In that letter, my priorities for my vocation as pastor are spelled out, and they are the same for every called and ordained minister of Word and Sacrament in the ELCA: to preach, teach, and administer the sacraments rightly. Over these past four

years as your pastor, I have heard how it may be confusing to have me present in worship yet not preaching. There are various reasons for this, Mostly because part of my call is to find and then lift up others who have gifts of participating in worship as leaders, readers, communion servers, and as preachers. Doing this allows me to live more fully into my call as your pastor and, at the same time, gives those present the opportunity of hearing the word of God preached through the voice of another sister or brother in Christ.

On those Sundays when someone else is preaching, leading, praying or serving—even when I am present—I encourage you to ask the Holy Spirit to open your eyes and ears to see and hear how, through these faithful people, God has a word for you!

God said it best: "My word does not return to me empty." (Isaiah 55:11) God's word is effective and living, and it always—ALWAYS—does something; whether in scripture, sermon or sacrament. For this, we give thanks! Amen!
