FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

²²News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; ²⁴for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. ~Acts 11:22-24

Dear Saints of Bone Lake Lutheran,

First of all, I would like to encourage you to read the rest of this story that's found in Acts, or if you're really ambitious, read the whole story of Acts. But for now, I can help you along with understanding these few verses here. Basically, the whole story of Acts is the story about the early Church, the disciples, and how the message of Jesus was spread. In this short section, we're learning about the church in Antioch. At this time, many early believers were scattered throughout the region because of persecution and generally just living in a large area that the message of Jesus had happened to spread to. Here, we're hearing about a few people who are continuing to listen to the Spirit and tell the Good News of Jesus to their neighbors. Because of their witness and devotion, many more heard about Jesus and the grace of God. Barnabas, one of Paul's friends, is so excited about this that goes to encourage these men to keep doing what they are doing and keep trusting in the Holy Spirit to lead them.

Now I know this is a very brief explanation of this story (which is why I encourage you to read more on your own), but it gets us to a certain point. In this story, we see the power

that the Holy Spirit has to lead us and our neighbors to a deeper faith or faith in general. Not only did the people of this story trust the Spirit's work to help them proclaim the Good News of God, but they trusted that this act would strengthen their own faith. Barnabas trusted this too and encouraged them to remain faithful in their devotion to God.

And this is what I also encourage you to do. With the school year starting and things being even more crazy than they have been, it's easy for our devotion to God to fall to the side. And it's understandable. But I would encourage you, as life gets busy, to remain faithful in your devotion to God. If you need some resources to help you do this, please feel free to reach out to me and I'll help get you going on something. But maybe even simple practices can help you. Martin Luther wrote some wonderful prayers for the morning and evening times. Maybe these prayers can be a small step in keeping up your life of faith. Saying something as you wake up and go to bed at night is a great way to book end your day with God on your mind. Or maybe you are interested in a short devotion to start or end your day, we can find a resource that is best for you. But no matter what it is, no matter which practice you choose, I pray that it helps you to remain faithful in your devotion to God and the work of the Holy Spirit. Maybe this month, we can take a lesson from the early Church and trust the work that the Holy Spirit does in us and our neighbors. And who knows, maybe we'll be able to witness someone coming to faith or having deeper faith in the grace of God. God's Blessings,

I found it was something I liked to do. Pen pals were a common addition to writing classes in grade school. For a few years I corresponded with a pen pal in Nome, Alaska. Thank you's for graduation and wedding gifts, and keeping in touch with friends and parents when I was in college were part of my writing experience as I got older. Christmas is a special time for letter-writing. I spent much time composing one trying not to brag and being as informative and interesting as possible. Through my 40+ years of letters, I have a family history.

Many books in the Bible are letters, Paul being the best known letter writer. The emphasis in his letters is that salvation from sin is only possible through faith. Of the 27 books in the New Testament, 21 are letters or epistles.

In recent years I admit my letter-writing has turned into note writing. With an I-Pad, computers, and all other ways to correspond, letter-writing has become a practice of the past. There are still benefits to writer and receiver for a hand-written note or letter we write to remind people they're special and it's a way to reach people you love. It confirms the importance of relationship. It helps you pause long enough to say things that matter— texting, e-mail are reactionary. You write because there's something you need to say, not something you need to know.
