FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

²² the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law. Romans 3:22-23, 28

Dear Saints of Bone Lake Lutheran,

In this month of October, we get to celebrate two things on the 31st. Not only is that Halloween, but this year, Reformation Sunday also happens to fall on that day. As Lutherans, we often celebrate this day by wearing red and giving a nod to Martin Luther. But what does Reformation Sunday really mean for us today? As a kid, what I described is how I mostly remember Reformation Sunday. To me, it mostly felt like a day we celebrated Luther’s tenacity and boldness in nailing his 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg. But as I’ve learned more about Luther himself and what exactly his 95 theses were all about, Reformation Sunday is much more than this.

Really, in the spirit of our Lutheranism, we should be celebrating reformation a lot more than just one Sunday a year. Because as Lutherans, we should always have a spirit of reform to us. At least I think that’s what Luther himself would think. Because for as much as we often long for how things used to be, we also, as we honor traditions, have to keep in mind that we always have to be reforming in order for our faith and the faith of others to grow. Luther recognized that the way the church in the 1500s was doing things, wasn’t the best for growing faith.

And granted, today we don’t do some of the things that they did back then, we still have to realize and embrace too that we have to do some things a little differently sometimes in order to listen to what the Spirit is calling us to. Without reformation, things get a little stagnant.

But even on top of all of this reforming, Luther had something else in mind that we remember on Reformation Sunday. In one of his better known works, *Freedom of the Christian*, Luther points out that we are both “perfectly free” and “a perfectly dutiful servant”. We’re free from the guilt and shame of sin through our faith in Christ for the ability to love and serve our neighbors. And so this is also a part of Reformation Sunday that we have to remember. Through the freedom we have in Christ, we’re called to the tradition of reformation and engagement with our faith and the Word of God. I think Luther would want us to focus on this instead of patting him on the back. While his boldness and tenacity are things to celebrate and sometimes things we too should aspire to, we also have to keep in mind that something even greater is the love and grace of God that we get to experience and show to others as well.

So this Reformation and Halloween Sunday, remember what Luther taught us and grow in your faith in Christ. And all the while, remember what it is to reform and live in a spirit of reformation.
